Possibly spend money on workshops - Previous years with online workshops, some technical issues were faced. Scheduling issues were also faced. Dawn states last years wasn't as effective as the two years prior. Would prefer a speaker in person. Suggestions made for purchasing parent resource books, or books related to mental health for children, learning differences. Dawn posed a question about how we envision if one book is purchased how would it be circulated to anyone who wants. Idea: 2 copies and a link, possibly digital copy. Action item: Send out a google form to find out what topic areas of interest to investigate – neurodiversity in students and how it is handled in school, learning disorders and how to support, artificial intelligence, mental health/anxiety, stuff that kids face. Similar presentation to a few years ago, Schneider, possible reach back out to her. Suggestion of a "Parent night/family night" but grant money can't be spent on food/entertainment. What needs to parents have and lets intentionally meet the need. Possible Workshop: Safron center – cyberworld and foundation of connection. \$199 designed for parents and caregivers. Putting out a survey with a few options might be a good starting point. Paw print going out Friday, put together a list of max 5 options for feedback, should hear about by mid next week. In person vs online option – most feel like the in-person option is the better idea for encouraging more engagement and school culture

Five ideas – Books/Resources, Speakers (ai, technology, saffron), experiential, mention that if you have other ideas to email the school email address.

Google form with two questions – one about topics, one about format of delivery. Dawn will put something together and send to Jayson.

#### SAPS Presentation to the City of St. Albert Council Meeting

The Alberta Government announced the \$8.6 billion School Construction Accelerator Program to build 90 new schools and modernize/replace 24 schools 2025-2027. Kristi Rouse presented to City Council the importance of having school sites ready and meeting the Governments 'check-list' to have St Albert Public approved for a new school build. We asked the city to approved the Area Structure Plan in the North East and help us have a school site larger enough for a new high school. The city approved the ASP's first reading on Nov 5<sup>th</sup>.

- The board passed Bylaw No. 2024-01, a bylaw where the St. Albert School Division deems that the election of five (5) trustee positions will be by general vote (at large) of the electors within the municipal boundaries of the City of St. Albert and provides the authority for entering into an agreement to hold a joint election in conjunction with the City of St. Albert be approved for first reading.
- The board passed Bylaw No. 2024-02, a bylaw that St. Albert School Division appoints the City of St. Albert's returning officer (Marta Caufield) as St. Albert School Division's returning officer and the St. Albert School Division appoints the City of St. Albert's alternate returning officer (Janice Vollrath) as St. Albert School Division's alternate returning officer be approved for first reading."
